Congratulations to a team of sixth to eighth grade students from Northley Middle School in Aston Township who have been named Best in State winners in the fifth annual Verizon Innovative Learning App challenge for their mobile app concept Garden Aid.



Northley Middle School is one of two winners from Pennsylvania. The students' winning app idea was selected from more than 1,800 submissions nationwide and aims to address problems that can keep people from successfully growing a garden. The Garden Aid app would provide insights on how to grow a thriving garden, from plant identification to tips and tricks for healthy plants.

The students earned a \$5,000 award from the Verizon Foundation for their school and tablets for each team member.

Local Taxes Due April 15

It's that time of year again. Your 2016 local earned income tax return is due on April 15. Did you know the quickest way to get your refund is to file online? If you live and work in Pennsylvania, you can e-file on our tax administrator's secure website, which is available 24/7 at www.KeystoneCollects.com.

Keystone Collections Group's e-file is the easy, fast and secure way to file your 2016 tax return. It lets you file your tax return when it is most convenient for you. You will need your W-2, your Social Security Number and any other income documents that may apply (such as a PA-UE or a Schedule C).

If you will be claiming an out-of-state tax credit or if you work in Philadelphia, you may be eligible for a local earned income tax credit up to the amount you owe to your resident municipality. The worksheet on the back of the form will help you calculate your out-of-state tax credit (attach a copy of your out-of-state filing).

If you have questions regarding local tax filing, call Keystone's Taxpayer Helpline at 1-888-328-0565 to speak with a local, knowledgeable Taxpayer Service Agent. You can also email your questions to "Taxpayer Support" at www.KeystoneCollects.com.

Taxpayers with earned income in 2016 are required to file a tax return by Friday, April 15.

Bulk Trash and Appliance Collection April 3-7

The Township Public Works Department provides curbside pickup service for residents seeking to dispose of bulk trash items or old appliances. The fee for this service is \$20 per item and is due in advance of pickup.

Residents must call the Township Building at 610-494-1636 in advance to schedule pickup and arrange payment. The cost **MUST** be paid in advance. All items for bulk trash and appliance collection must be placed at the curb by 6 a.m. on the day of your regular trash collection.

Curbside Tree Branch Pickup

The Aston Township Public Works department will offer curbside collection of tree branches (no larger than four inches (4"). They will not pick up large tree limbs or trunks. Collection of tree branches must be scheduled by calling the Public Works department 610-494-8005 and will be offered April 17-21.
