Aston Township Historical Society has several exciting events coming up this fall. All events will be held at the ACC.

On Thursday, September 15 at 7 p.m. local historian Nancy Webster will tell the unbelievable story of the Battle of Brandywine and its effects on the residents of Aston. The Battle was held September 11, 1777 and the huge British encampment covered all the land from Route 1, Baltimore Pike to Village Green. Both armies traveled through Aston down Concord road to Chester.

Wednesday, October 4 at 7 p.m. there will be Meet the Authors event, book sale, and book signing for *Living in Fisher's Corner, Aston, PA in the 1950s*. John Macfarland, Mac, Lee Smitham, Mort, Clarence Hickey, and Corky have put their photos, stories, and so many memories into a fun look back to the simpler times of our town. Come meet them, share a story or two, buy a book and get their signatures. All costs were covered by the authors and all proceeds will go to the ATHS.

The Aston District Courthouse is located at One New Road, Aston, Pa 19014 and it serves Aston Township as well as Wards 3&4 of Upper Chichester Township.

District Court is the first level of Pennsylvania's Unified Judicial System and hears civil cases up to \$12,000 as well as criminal cases and matters of bail and criminal arraignments.
