National Autism Awareness Month; New Handicapped Accessible Play- ground Initiative Announced

April was recognized as National Autism Awareness Month by the Board of Commissioners. Autism Awareness Month represents an excellent opportunity to promote autism awareness, autism acceptance and to draw attention to the tens of thousands facing an autism diagnosis each year. Nearly a quarter of a century ago, the Autism Society launched a nationwide effort to promote autism awareness, inclusion and self-determination for all, and to assure that each person with Autism Spectrum Disorder is provided the opportunity to achieve their highest possible quality of life.

Commissioner Carol Graham also announced the Smiles in the Playground initiative. The Township has obtained funding to build a new special needs playground they are lovingly calling Smiles in the Playground. The park will be located on the grounds of the Community Center.

“When you enter our town you are welcomed by a sign that reads ‘Aston Township, a Community that Cares’ and as we recognize Autism Awareness Month it gives me great pleasure to also announce and celebrate for all our children our Aston Township Project, Smiles in the Playground,” said Commissioner Graham.

- Special Needs Playground (Smiles in the Playground) – \$ 200,000
 - Design, Play System, Components and Fall Area

April Recognized as PA 811 Safe Digging Month

Engineers, excavators, and homeowners work to keep pace with the Commonwealth's unprecedented economic development, by dialing 8-1-1 in advance of excavation to minimize damage to underground utility lines, danger to workers, environmental pollution and loss of utility service to Pennsylvania citizens.

This unique service provides easy, one-call notification about excavation projects which may endanger workers and jeopardize utility lines while promoting workplace and public safety reducing underground utility damage, minimizing utility service interruptions and protecting the environment.

All excavators and homeowners are encouraged to dial 8-1-1 at least three business days prior to an excavation project, even something as small as planting a tree, installing a mailbox post or replacing a driveway.

Public Works, Working for You

Public Works repaired 124 potholes using 3 tons of cold patch asphalt last month. They also installed "one way" sign at Aston Middletown Little League entrance; repaired a sink hole on Anvil Road; began a new playground installation at Valley View park; and removed a fallen tree on Mount Road and from Gettysburg Retention Pond.
